## JUNE MISSION OFFERING: ST. ANDREW'S REFUGEE SERVICES

2020 was an incredibly challenging year for St. Andrew's and the StARS ministry. As for many all over the globe, COVID 19 has impacted us here in Egypt in countless ways. Last March, due to the pandemic and the uncertainties around things such as emergency medical care, my husband Steve and I were evacuated by the ELCA to the USA. After many months



away we were finally granted permission to return in early September. Despite being far from congregation members and the church, I was able to support the congregation and ministries like many pastors found themselves doing--through Zoom and a daily newsletter. We worshipped together every week on You Tube and gathered in Zoom coffee hours. Like most congregations we "pivoted" in ways that were unexpected, and yet somehow this time has managed to bring us closer together as well.

Our six refugee led partner congregations faced many difficult challenges this past year as well. To stem the tide of COVID infections, for seven months churches and mosques across Egypt were closed per order of the Egyptian Government. Without a safe place to worship, several of our partner congregations took to small gatherings in homes or

finding outdoor spaces to gather off site. Due to restrictions, these gatherings were not safe and so most church members simply stayed home. Some of the churches utilized Facebook and other electronic means of sharing in worship but, as the Pastors shared with me over the summer, access to internet was (and remains to be) a challenge for most congregation members. COVID infection continues to be significant in many of the congregations with high numbers of individuals ill, but lacking access to medical care or the ability to get tested. Last summer the Englishspeaking congregation gathered emergency funds to share with

pastors who saw their small salaries drying up due to the absence of tithes and community members unable to pay rent. This year since February our congregations have been meeting in person in a smaller capacity and with limited schedules. We continue to walk alongside as many people as we can in these days as we are experiencing what

is being called a "third wave" of COVID here in Egypt.

The StARS Ministry has been nothing short of amazing this past year facing the challenges that COVID brought. As director Chris Eades recently wrote in his letter for the StARS annual report:

"In common with many others, we did not see the pandemic coming, but StARS quickly realized that it would be crucial for us to remain open, to offset the service closures of UNHCR and international organizations so that we could continue to respond in-person to emergency need, and to raise and reallocate resources to cash grants and other forms of direct assistance so that we could soften some of the harshest impacts on displaced people. In these two goals we have been successful but we must acknowledge that we have been unable to prevent the widespread proliferation of extreme poverty, suffering, and desperation among displaced communities in Egypt. Only with systemic change, the recognition of refugee and migrant rights, and a reduction in conflict and inequality can be hope to

# **ChurchWorks:**

Govans Session met on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 for their regular meeting. We reviewed the quarterly financial reports with Pam Wallace and approved a proposal to repair the window alcove plaster, masonry, and flashing in the front of the sanctuary.



We also approved the continuation of a single worship service through Easter of 2022. Technological and COVID-19 concerns led us to continue with a

single worship service as we have thus far during the pandemic. We will continue to enjoy the talented musical leadership of Mary Hamlin-Spencer and Lea Gilmore, the Govans quartet and choir, and the Govans band in Sunday services with an equal representation and continued diversity of musical styles. We will revisit the desirability of a single service after Easter of next year.

We also approved increasing the maximum number of worship participants in the sanctuary to fifteen beginning this Sunday. The previously approved COVID-19 guidelines will allow for twenty worship participants in the sanctuary on June 13. Please contact the church office to request an in-person spot for an upcoming service.

Finally, we approved the examination of McKenna Traynham for ordination as a ruling elder. She will be ordained on Sunday, June 6, 2021.

fundamentally alter the situation of the displaced. More now than ever, it is essential that StARS offers immediate and effective responses that improve live, while working for long-term change, human rights, and the transfer of power and leadership to the displaced."

StARS has been heroic in their efforts to continue to provide emergency food, housing, cash grants, legal and education support as well as psycho-social support and a sense of welcome even amidst this time of pandemic. They have been, and continue to be a major source of assistance including acting as a distribution

hub for emergency food and hygiene boxes and a continued advocate for refugees in Egypt. Their staff has literally put their bodies on the front line during this crisis to make sure access to services never stops. As a church and community, we applaud and support them in their amazing work.

Overall, the staff and community members of St. Andrews and StARS continue to weather this time with resilience and strength, and I am personally inspired each day by all who enter our gates. We are so grateful for the prayers and support of congregations like Govans, longstanding partners in ministry who have faithfully provided care, support, and prayers. Please know that we are praying for your church and ministry as well. If you have any questions or would like to

# SUPPORTING GOVANS THROUGH TAX-ADVANTAGED GIVING

Good news for Senior Citizens! If you are at least 72 years old and must make a Required Minimum Distribution from your tax-deferred IRA accounts, you may be able to take advantage of another provision of the Congressionally-approved SECURE Act. A Qualified Charitable Distribution is a direct transfer of assets from an IRA to Govans, which can provide you with additional benefits.

First, if made properly the amount will be treated as a reduction of your Required Minimum Distribution, up to total contributions in a year of \$100,000. The effect would be to reduce your ordinary income, which could decrease income taxes. It could also reduce income-based surcharges on such things as Medicare Parts B and D.

Second, if you use the standard deduction to calculate your taxes, and are unable to itemize charitable contributions, using Qualified Charitable Distributions can give you the ability to get some benefit from such contributions. For example, it is a great way to cover your annual pledge to Govans.

Other options to contribute to Govans continue to include legacy gifts from your estate or trust. Of course, you may make regular cash donations, or of appreciated securities. Often these are matched by employers, so please check that possibility. There may be different, but significant, tax advantages to these methods. This may seem complicated, and, admittedly, these paragraphs do not provide everythingyou need to know. Therefore, it is important to consult your tax advisor, financial consultant or IRA custodian for complete details about making a Qualified Charitable Distribution transfer.
