Dear Friends.

As we begin this new year, I am inspired by the words of Isaiah 43:19, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." It can be easy in trying and uncertain times to feel like things are getting worse and that good things are coming to an end. Those feelings are legitimate and real. We need to grieve our losses. Don't rush grief.

At the same time, God is always doing something new. Something new is always being born. God is the source of new life, rebirth, and healing. The



question Isaiah asks is critical as we look forward to 2022. Do you perceive the newness? It's there. Do you perceive it?

If you do not perceive it, try looking closer. Try paying attention to the newness of this day. Try noticing and



I hope you had a wonderful Advent and Christmastide. I was immensely proud of all of our Govans youth and young families who played a part in our Christmas pageant, Masks in the Manger! Thank you for sharing your acting skills with Govans!



If one of your New Year's Resolutions is to get to know your neighbors, I hope that you'll consider joining Govans' Conversation Corps team. This group of volunteers engages in quarterly one-on-one conversations with neighbors in the York Road area to help our church make better use of the strengths in our context, as well as better meet the needs of those around us. These simple conversations are a powerful tool to keep us connected and foster new opportunities for ministry in our community. Let's talk about how God might be calling you to this important ministry of conversation.

Intergenerational Sunday School will relaunch for the spring 2022 season on Sunday, January 23, 2022. On the first Sunday of the month, Intergenerational Sunday School for families and kids takes place at 11:05 am on the playground. Every other week, Intergenerational Sunday School takes place between the services at 10:05 am. We will gather inside the Education Building in the gallery and/or Sharp Hall (as space is needed/available) for "stations" Sunday school. 

Govans Youth Servant Leaders Give Back to their Community

Govans' Youth Servant Leader program challenges older youth (grades 8 to 12) to become leaders in both our congregation and our community. A one-year commitment to the program includes monthly leadership in worship, service to the church, and service to the community. There is also a monthly Youth Servant Leader Council meeting to process how these commitments are going and reflect how participants are growing as leaders. This year, the theme of the program is "liturgy and leadership." Each month during our servant leader council meetings, we are studying a different aspect of Christian worship and what it teaches us about Christian leadership. After one year of service in the YSL program, youth are invited to join the congregation as a member.



This year's youth servant leaders have recently chosen their service projects:

- Kaylyn Parks will be serving on the Baltimore Neighborhood Indicators Alliance's Project VITAL Youth Advisory Board. Project VITAL works to green and restore vacant lots in Baltimore to improve health outcomes for adolescents.
- Matthew Moore and Claire Wilson will be sending cards to homebound and geographically distanced members
 and friends of Govans Presbyterian Church. Claire Wilson will also be volunteering to help with signage and outreach for the church.
- McKenna Traynham will volunteer with the Senior Network of North Baltimore to make wellness phone calls to local older adults.



WHY I JOINED GOVANS' RACIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

I joined Govans Presbyterian in 1996 when my husband and two children moved here from Cleveland. Govans has been a moral and spiritual compass for our family over the years. The Racial Justice Ministry is one of many efforts Govans has undertaken to understand and engage in the community around us, and this emphasis on active and involved faith is exactly why we chose Govans as our family's church home.

I share with Adam Allen the role of Co-Chair of the Racial Justice Ministry Working Group (RJMWG) - a group of congregation and community leaders actively working with our Racial Justice Minister, Lea Gilmore to create and implement programming and more. Adam and I have the responsibility to guide the committees established to address the ministry's goals and to communicate the ministry's goals and activities to the rest of the congregation.

Govans' racial justice ministry intends to provide a safe environment for our faith community to learn about the systemic nature and impact of racism in the United States, as well as in our own church and hearts. Specific opportunities for growth have included book studies, presentations and engagement with local brown/black leaders in the community.

An understanding of how racism is continuing to mar our society and limit our black brothers and sisters will compel us to strive to address and dismantle that communal and personal racism.

In the context of the Govans' community this means we will listen to all racial groups, seeing all as equal. Individually and collectively, we will speak up when we see or hear a racist comment or action. Stand beside and actively support those fighting for change, advocate for a just society. In addition, we will continue to educate

ourselves about racial justice (or the lack of it) in our community. And doing all this with a spirit of love.

As an anti-racist church, we will understand and confront racism. We build the body of Christ by 'speaking the truth in love.' The history of the United States must be examined and owned by the church so that we can address the past and current practices of racism that go against the very Scriptures we are called to follow.

What has this work meant for me? Well it has been truly eye opening to learn about the systemic nature of racism alive and well in our community now. No one is exempt or immune - it is part of the air we breathe, the business and government rules we all live by. I believe that shining a light on this issue and finding ways to address it is one of the most important things that I and Govans can do for the long term health of our church, the Govans community and Baltimore.
