GOVANS PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY

Black History Month was created by Dr. Carter G. Woodson. Realizing the to focus attention of the public on the vast contributions of African American citizens. in 1926. Dr. Woodson organized "Negro History Week" which was expanded with help οf other prominent African

Americans, into "Negro History month." Woodson chose the month of February, because both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass were born during the month. Since 1976, every U.S.



president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating Black history."

It is important to recognize Black History

is American history and should not be confined to 28/29 days of the year. There is so much to be learned (and unlearned).





Usually, when students learn about Black history in class, their lessons are limited to slavery or the civil rights era. Don't get me wrong: these are integral parts of our story, and it's encouraging to read stories that show our strength, perseverance, and ability to overcome so many adversities. I am proud to come from a culture filled with people who were bold and brave enough to fight for our freedom and rights. But in the same breath, I can't help but feel disappointed that our students are not learning about the vastness of our greatness. After all, we are much more than just an oppressed culture. As we continue to fight the forces that want to sanitize and edit the aggregate of African Americans' experiences and contributions, we embrace the continued relevance of Black History Month and the absolute necessity that this history be taught and celebrated throughout the year.

The 365-page book of the coming year is not blank at all. For one thing it is filled with commitments we have already made. Commitments to family and friends. Commitments to employers. Commitments to God. Sure those commitments can be (or may need to be) broken, but until they are, the year is not blank. The year is also filled with things we can't see or predict and which are out of our control: illnesses, deaths, loss of income, world events. It's as if we have that 365-page book but we can only open it one page at a time. We can guess what things are already going to be on the page when we turn it and other things will be a total surprise.

But, the spirit of Brad Paisley's words are true. We do have choices. We have blank spaces we get to fill in. We can fill those blank spaces with gratitude and beauty, peace and joy, faith and hope. Perhaps these are the colors we paint upon the pages and we can choose those colors even in the hardest times. Also, we can choose to end some commitments that are not life giving, or mend some commitments to bring new life to them, or make new commitments as we follow the Spirit's promptings in our life.

Perhaps the best part of this book metaphor is that we don't have to wait for any certain day on an arbitrary calendar to make new choices. Every morning we turn a new page in the book of our lives and every day we make choices about how to fill in the blank spaces. What colors will we paint around the commitments we made in pages past? What good choices will we make each day that will have a positive effect on every future page waiting to be turned? Every day starts a new year. Every morning is a new page. It's not blank, but we do get to participate in how the rest of the story will unfold.


