GOVANS TO VISIT HARRIET TUBMAN'S BIRTHPLACE & MUSEUM IN JUNE

The Racial Justice Ministry has planned a visit to Harriet Tubman's birthplace on the Eastern Shore **Saturday, June 17**, (rain date, June 24). We will leave in carpools at 9:30 a.m. from the Govans parking lot and travel to Church Creek, MD. and begin at the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad State Park. We will enjoy our lunches (brought from home) in a park pavilion and tour the museum. From there we will visit Brodess Farm where Harriet was born into slavery and spent her earliest years.

Then, we will then make our way to Cambridge,

Maryland where we will see the Harriet Tubman mural and visit the Harriet Tubman Museum and Educational Center. After a stop for afternoon tea/coffee we will travel north to return home.

SECOND SERVICE MUSIC NEWS

Sunday May 21 will be a day of is a joyous musical celebration of music; the Govans Handbell Choir will be presenting a glorious theme on the hymn tune *Hyfrydol*, which is in the celebration of Easter. There are seven Sundays in the Easter season, and with May 21 being the last of them, we are reigning in the joy of the season through this beautiful tune. We will also have the joy of hearing a beautiful handbell duet for eight bells, played by Maria Wong and Ashley Short. Did I say two people will be ringing eight bells? Yes, I did! Typically, ringers ring with one bell in a hand at a time, and if they have to ring more than two bells in any given piece of music, they have to put down a bell (or bells) and pick up the new bell(s) in just enough time to come in with the notes. Both Maria and Ashley will be playing a piece that requires two bells in each hand, known as "four in hand."



This coming June, you get to look forward to the choir singing a very challenging piece in Russian. *Bogoroditse Devo*, or *Rejoice, Mother of God*, is a choral piece part of Rachmaninoff's Vespers "All-Night-Vigil." Rachmaninoff composed this piece in 1915, after he had written another lengthy choral piece of similar vein, Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom, which he was not satisfied with. The All Night Vigil is a rich piece of choral music history, and is considered one of the biggest choral masterpieces of the early 1900's. This movement of the piece is the most-performed movement out of the entire 15 movement piece. Join us on June 4 for this musical masterpiece!

their thrones are going to necessarily experience some unpleasantness, as those who have been oppressed rejoice that the boot is off their neck.

Did you know there is an opposite feeling to schadenfreude? It is freudenfreude. As you might guess this is rejoicing at the good fortune of others. It is being happy at other people's happiness. It strikes me that to experience true freudenfreude, the joy others are feeling must be a joy that comes at no one else's expense. It must be a just joy.

Because if we experience joy when others are experiencing joy at some else's expense, isn't that ultimately a form of schadenfreude?

I believe one of the main purposes of being alive is to be happy and experience pleasure. That may seem shallow or hedonistic but only if the joy we seek is a selfish joy that disregards how our pursuit of happiness may do harm to others. But, if we can find joy, happiness and pleasure in a way that allows everyone else to experience joy, happiness, and pleasure then it seems like we are getting awfully close to the kin-dom of heaven. 13th century mystic Meister Eckhart agrees. He wrote, "To rejoice at another person's joy is like being in heaven."

So let's watch out for unjust schadenfreude and cultivate a just freudenfreude as we continue on this journey together as followers of Christ.

SOUL KITCHEN

Each and every Sunday, Soul Kitchen hands out bags consisting of two separate meals, each including a protein, veggie and starch. In addition, many weeks we also serve a dinner sized veggie stuffed green salad. We also give out eating utensils, something to drink and a baked dessert. All this is put into recyclable containers and handed out in a donated paper bag.

JUNE MISSION OFFERING:

ST. ANDREW'S REFUGEE MINISTRY

St. Andrew's United Church is a very small church in downtown Cairo, but it is home to **St. Andrew's Refugee Ministry (StARS)** a huge refugee ministry. Jean Isteero, a member here at Govans, started an English and General Education program at St. Andrew's in 1986 and it has grown in all directions since then. Refugees feel safe to be on the St. Andrew's compound where they can sit and talk with their friends and attend worship and educational activities. St. Andrew's United Church of Cairo depends upon contributions from churches like ours to be able to continue its very valuable work. Below is a recent report from their pastor, Rev. Christie Manisto.

StARS continues to be busy during this time of economic challenge in Egypt. With the devaluation of the Egyptian pounds running at almost 50% against the USD and inflation at about 25%, stresses on the refugee population continue to be difficult. Ability to access accommodation, medical care and even food is constrained. StARS continues to provide a range of services, and is particularly looking at ways of alleviating the financial situation for refugees. We are currently distributing food and hygiene boxes and medical and educational grants through a number of different projects.

In the Education Department this year, 256 students enrolled in the Children's Education Program and 46 in preschool. Moreover, the Education Department partnered with four new Community Based Organisations (CBO) and provided them with teacher training for 111 teachers and as well as training school management training for 7 school leaders.

This year has been very busy for visitors. We have hosted a visit from the Resourcing Refugee Leadership initiative, the Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration and Secours Catholique so far this year and we are expecting a visit from the ELCA in March

In the coming month we are starting work on a new livelihoods project which will see women from female headed households taking training in upcycling (reusing old materials in new ways), and understanding climate change, as well as being supported to start new businesses.
