

This text emerged from a study of the attention in Levitical laws to the well-being of the land, especially by calling for fallow periods, or "land sabbaths," to preserve the soil. 2 Chronicles 36:21 even suggests that the Babylonian exile may have resulted from abusing the land.

Psalm 23 – How We Profess Our Faith vs. How We Sometimes Live Our Faith

We are sometimes reluctant to trust as the psalmist does, we recite, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." But do we live this way? Yet we live in a way that says, "The Lord is not my shepherd; I do want." Spend a few minutes turning each positive into a negative and each negative into a positive, write the psalm in your own words. See how this changes the psalm. Notice what feelings arise in you with these changes. How does this change your view of the prayer? Then spend a few moments rereading the original psalm. Do you see it differently? What changes do you need to make in order to live the words of the original psalm?
